1. THE COURSE AIM AND SCOP

The aim – the formation of Russian language skills among students within the framework of the I certification level for the implementation of communicative opportunities in the socio-cultural and professional fields.

The course focuses on:

Introducing students to the language and culture of its speakers, the system of moral values and evaluative-emotional attitude to the world.

Learning a specialty language.

Education through the reading and understanding of various types of text of reproductive and productive monologues, dialogues, reproductive and productive written speech, listening to monologic and dialogic speech.

The "Russian language" course to a core part of the "Humanities, Social, and Economic" requirements, which belongs to the compulsory study of a foreign language for the basic educational program "General Medicine".
